His presentation will include how this system works; the city's improvement plans and how the most critical solutions are made. **Our "great flood" of 2009** will be addressed. Following his presentation, the floor will be open for Q&A. A brief business meeting will precede the presentation for a review of SSCN activities, actions and focus for 2010 as well as an election of new Directors.
